

## Art Department homework tasks

### Year 9

### Masks

At times students may be asked to complete homework tasks not detailed on this list.

1. Look in magazines and on the Internet and find pictures of disguised, painted or tattooed faces and masks and stick in book in an interesting way.
2. Use a viewfinder and choose a section of the collage from homework number 1. Enlarge and draw the section. Add shading using a 2b and 4b pencil.
3. Research. Find out information about masks from around the world. Go to the library to research in books and on the Internet. The research must be well presented with pictures and written in your own words to show understanding. Include information about the artist and his or her work. You must also include your own views and opinions about the work.
4. Look in the mirror and make a line drawing of yourself. Include head and shoulders as well as details of your face. Line only.
5. Read the comments made by your teacher about homework number 4. Re draw your self-portrait. Imagine you are going o a fancy dress ball. You can decide on your character. Do anything you want to disguise your face in order to transform your portrait into your chosen character. Use hats, masks, make-up, wigs etc. Use a range of materials.
6. Bring in items and materials from home to help you with your mask-making e.g. fabric, coloured paper, wool, string, tin foil etc.
7. Design a mask to represent a mood or emotion. Your teacher will give you suggestions. Use colour and a range of materials.
8. Design a mask to represent one of the 4 seasons. Use colour and a range of materials.
9. If a competition is being held then this will be a homework task.
10. Sometimes students may be asked to bring in items to use in the classroom e.g. newspaper, magazines, collage materials.
